

INTRODUCTION

A private sector think-tank for public infrastructure in the Czech Republic





Investing in our future and economic growth, following the example of developed countries, means radically change our approach, cooperate more, increase productivity and engage private capital

Quality, reliable and affordable infrastructure must serve as the foundation of our competitiveness in the EU. One of our advantages is the central location in Europe, as everywhere is the same distance from us. As Europe expands eastwards, we can become an important hub for Europe's transport, energy and data networks - but it is only up to us to exploit this potential. Poland can take it from us, because it is investing more and is building infrastructure faster and without delays.

We can achieve better! We can leverage the unique potential of HSR's convergence with high-capacity direct-current transmission lines (HVDC) as part of the European **Supergrid** for long-distance electricity transmission, which might lower our energy costs. But as the HSR development advances, it is now high time to decide.

Accelerating development | A project preparation is often hindered by hasty errors rather than by unfavourable legislation. Timely and properly executed SEA, EIA and ESG can accelerate the preparation of large-scale infra projects and secure financing. Our railway was built 170 years ago, and its foundations are still serving us today. The world is changing, but the essence of the professions remains. Sustainable and climate resilient investments make perfect sense.

Simpler and predictable public procurement is essential | Complicated procurement processes hinder public investments and increases costs. Simpler rules and a more predictable environment are required. Issues include formalistic qualification, selection of the cheapest bidder, inconsistent interpretation, length of review and clientelism of contracting authorities. Common sense must be brought back into public procurement, in conjunction with the OJEU.

More from every koruna invested | Investment needs are constantly growing. We aim to complete 500 km of motorway network by 2033, connect regional cities and deliver 700 km of HSR over the next 15 years. This will require to invest €8-10bn per year. Every koruna invested in construction raises our GDP by 0.90 koruna, and the state budget revenues rise proportionately. We need to cut spending, but it is worth investing!

Multi-source financing instead of subsidies | The growth in spending on defence, energy and competitiveness and the decline in European subsidies, especially for roads, will lead to growing concerns about the stability of public finance. It is an essential that we use a **multi-source financing framework** for strategic investments, led by the strong NDB, financial instruments and private capital, in the form of commercial loans, bonds and PPPs.

- 4. Promotion of wider use of the **BEST VALUE method** in public procurement focused on quality assessment under the Czech Procurement Act.
- 5. Promoting sustainable, resilient and climate proof infrastructure projects and their preparation according to ESG and sustainable finance standards.

Statutes

ARI is a non-profit entity with the legal form of a Registered Association, which must respect the legal rules set forth regarding its establishment. The Statutes regulates the internal organisation (bodies, their rights and obligations, conditions of conduct, etc.) and other rules of operation. Membership for 2025

Full membership is open to any legal or natural person from a private sector interested in supporting the main objectives of ARI and, where appropriate, actively participating in professional discussions and the promotion of conceptual changes in the Czech infrastructure sector. Membership is granted upon acceptance by the Steering Committee and payment of the fee.

The total cost of membership is composed of (i) a membership fee for the main activities and (ii) a service charge to the extent and in the amount determined by the decision of the General Assembly. The two amounts are inseparable and are valid for a calendar year.

A service charge is invoiced to members on a one-off basis, in addition to a membership fee. The services include the organisation of and participation in conferences, workshops, debates and working groups. The amount of payment depends on the member's annual turnover:

The Membership fee is not subject to VAT. The Service charge and the Total membership are stated in CZK excluding VAT. The invoice is always due within 90 days from the beginning of the accounting period (January) for which the fee is to be paid. For banking institutions, the above Total membership is the final amount invoiced in CZK including VAT.
